and the children had fun on the swings and slides.





SACIG MEETING





SACIG stands for the South African Cochlear Implant Group. All team members working in the field of cochlear implant belong to this group which was established as a body to promote high standard of care for cochlear implant recipients. As you are aware number of there are а professionals involved in the process of you getting a cochlear implant and it is important that these professionals provide the service at a level that meets the standard of best practice. SACIG has developed guidelines and is involved in providing training and

working with the various companies to improve service delivery.

Each year in May there is a SACIG AGM (business meeting) and an academic meeting where we share information, get product updates from the companies and have international speakers. The SACIG Executive moves between the teams on a biannual basis and at present the JCIP forms the Executive. This meant that it was our responsibility to arrange the meeting this year.

The meeting was held on the 4th and 5th of May and was very successful. There is a category for consumer members which means that you are entitled to join SACIG and join us for future academic meetings. At present there are only two consumer members but as more people join we will be able to include more sessions in our meetings that are relevant for you as the consumer.

PRODUCT UPDATES

Cochlear Nucleus 6 System



Cochlear will be releasing their Nucleus 6 system. This system uses SmartSound IQ to help you hear better in different listening environments with the exciting new feature of wind noise reduction and it is ready for a number of wireless accessories that are being developed. To get an idea of the advantages of the new system you can go to cochlearimplanthelp.com and read more about the Nucleus 6 system which initially will be

compatible with the Freedom and 512 implants.



The exciting news is that everyone who has had an initial switch-on after 1st May 2013 will get a free upgrade to the new processor (providing you return the processor that you were fitted with at switch-on).

Nucleus 5 users still have the option of using the Aqua Accessory if they want to swim with their processor on.



MedEl Rondo



This is the first single unit processor available for cochlear implants. This new, compact audio processor design combines the coil, control unit, and battery pack into a single device that is worn off the ear. The Rondo is compatible with all MedEl electrode arrays. Google MedEl Rondo for more information.



MedEI have recommended to us that we trial this new processor with adults first. It is advisable to use a retention clip that is attached to the processor and to your clothes as you will no longer have an earhook to hold the processor in place.
